Indian Land Action Council representative Wanda Rosa addressed the board, stating that the council was receiving a lot of questions about future schools for Indian Land and busing of students to Lancaster schools. She stated that, unfortunately, Indian Land residents often miss information in the newspaper. She invited board members to action council meetings and stated the Lancaster County School District was a good system and she was proud to be a part of the system.

Concerned Lancaster resident Melissa Horton addressed the board, describing herself a "self-appointed crime watch president for Meeting Street." She stated that she is working with City of Lancaster to improve lighting on Meeting Street and has noticed that the entrance to Clinton Elementary is very dark and the area where students are dropped off is overgrown. She is concerned about students walking to school in the dark as the time changes because a lot of students walk to school unaccompanied. She wants to know if the city council or school board would be responsible for improving the lighting at the school driveway and for trimming the overgrowth.
