FA & SP USH AP (2)	Gov/Econ	What are the costs associated with the program? Classes are approximately \$111 per credit hour. It is recommended that a student take two classes per semester. So, for approximately \$3,340, a student could receive 30 credit hours, which is equivalent to one year of college. The same number of credits at a 4-year institution costs significantly more.

About Future Scholar South Carolina's 529 College Saving Plan - Grow your college savings free from taxes. Saving in a Future Scholar account helps you keep more money for actual college expenses. That's because the money in your account is not taxed as it grows and you can withdraw it tax-free.

You're in control - You decide when, where and who can use the money you save, even after your child turns 18. They can use their savings at a variety of schools in the US or internationally. If your child doesn't need the money because they receive a scholarship or they decide not to attend college, you can transfer the account to another beneficiary or leave the money in your account for future use.

Low impact on financial aid - When it comes time to apply for financial aid, only a small percentage of the account's value (currently 5.64% or less) is factored in when determining your expected family contribution and financial aid each academic year.

No income or age limits - Anyone can open a Future Scholar account, regardless of age or income. You can set up an account for a child, teenager or even an adult.

High contribution limit - Family and friends can also establish Future Scholar accounts for the same child, as long as the total of all accounts is not more than \$400,000 per beneficiary.
