Dr. Phipps recognized Mr. Walker, who introduced Ms. Kelly. She reviewed the audit and stated the district received a clean, unqualified opinion.

She thanked the accounting staff for its cooperation and commended the district for its financial program. The report will be presented for approval during Dec. 12 meeting.

Leader in Me update-IHAK, LB Dr. Phipps recognized Dr. Blackwell, who introduced Ms. Stinson, Ms. Mickles, Ms. Ribelin and Mr. Faile.

The three principals gave an update on the program at their schools and how the program was affecting student leadership, behavior and classroom performance.

Mr. Faile then thanked the principals for their work to make the program a success and reiterated the programs' goal – to teach students the skills they need to be successful after graduation.

Dr. Blackwell then shared with the board the district's plans to train middle and high school teachers so that they can help students continue to build the skills the program teaches.

Dr. Phipps recognized Mr. Small, who reported on maintenance activities and that bond referendum projects are on schedule.

With no other business before the board, the chair adjourned the meeting at 8:09 p.m.
