The chair noted that during the board's May 15 regular board meeting, the board reviewed a proposed budget based on the best information our finance office had on state revenues. *The Lancaster News*, the *Carolina Gateway* and the *Rock Hill Herald* did stories on the proposed budget.

And this year, the district, as it does every year, placed ads in local newspapers outlining the budget and how it will change from the year before. State law requires that the district run one ad at least two weeks before the proposed budget is voted on by the board.

Although the law requires publication only once in one newspaper, the district ran the ad in *The Lancaster News* two days – June 8 and 10 – and in the *Kershaw News-Era* June 13.

The district also ran two ads in the *Lancaster News* and an ad in the *Kershaw News-Era* inviting the public to come sit down with the superintendent June 14 to take a look at the budget.
