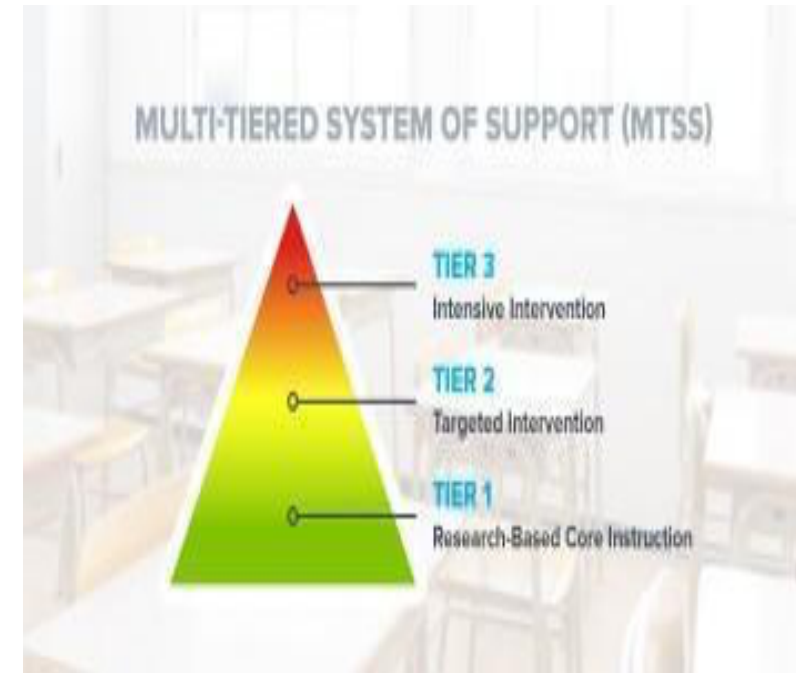

Purpose: To deliver early intervention for every student who struggles to attain or maintain grade-level performance by effectively utilizing best instructional practices within an evidence-based instructional model.

Facts:

- MTSS is a differentiated layering of academic and behavioral supports
- Framework to improve instruction to ensure all students are college and career ready
- Strategic, data-based problem solving to improve instruction for all students
- Analysis of multiple data sources to determine the effectiveness of instruction and intervention needed
- Teams collaborate and problem solve in regards to academic and behavioral needs

Tier 2 – Targeted Small Group Instruction (performance **slightly** below expectations).

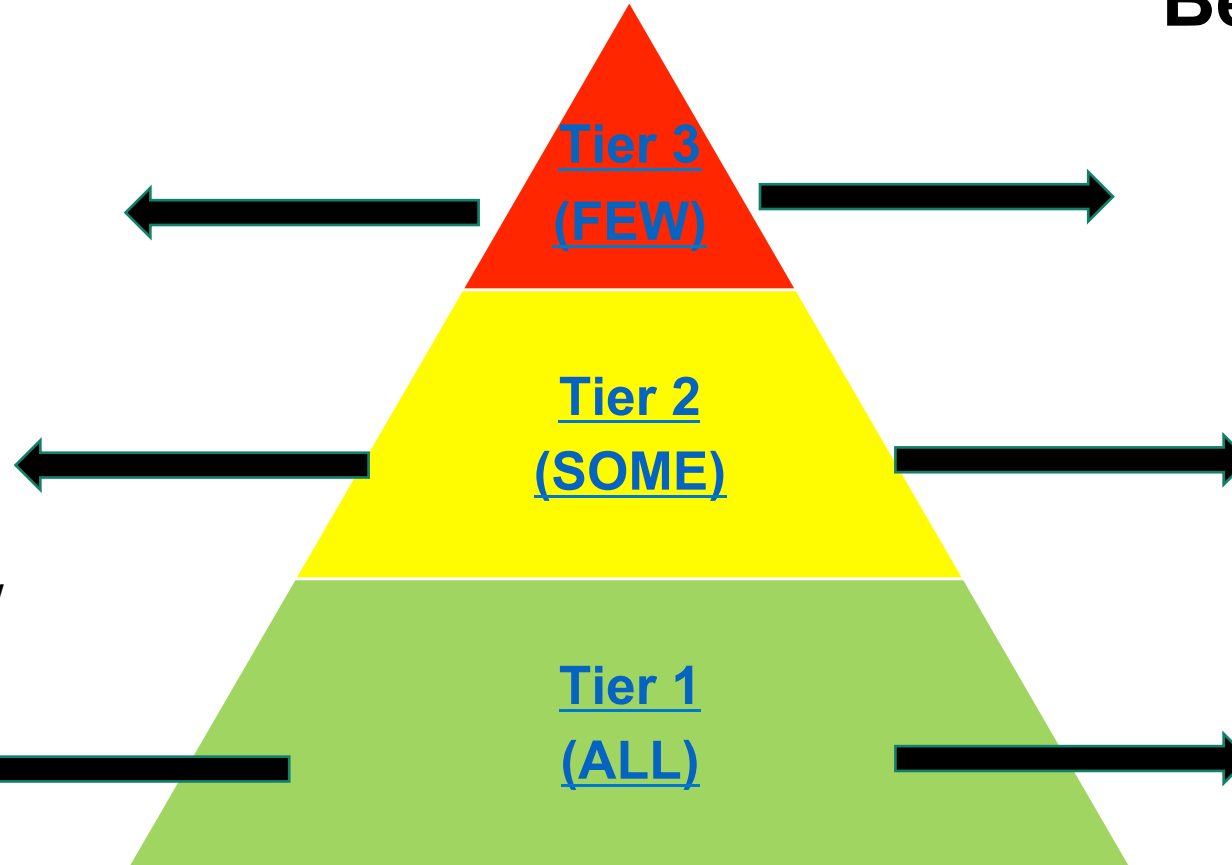
Tier 1 – Core instruction delivered to all students

Behavioral/Social Emotional

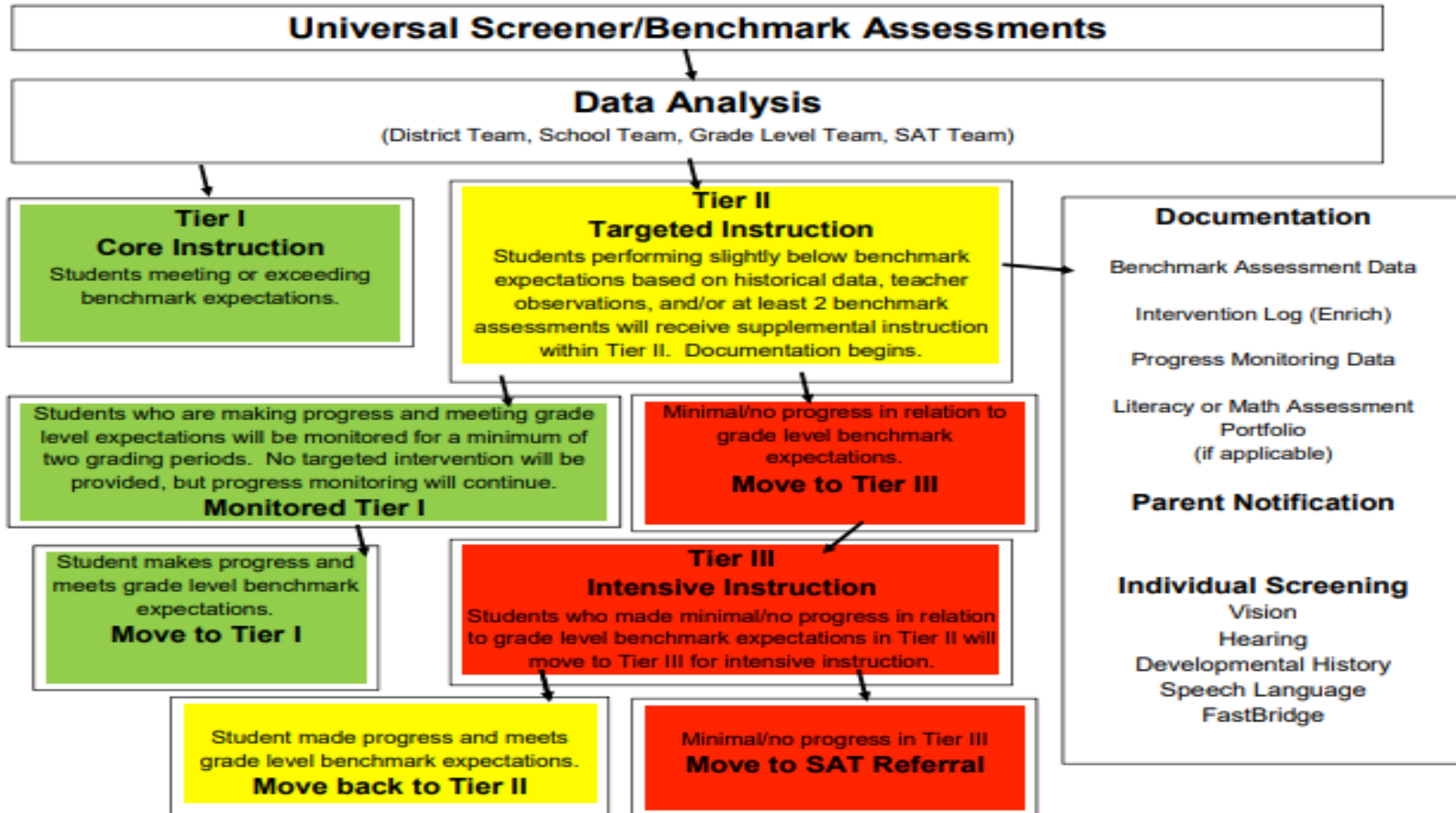
Tier 3 – Individualized Behavior Supports (performance **significantly** below expectations).

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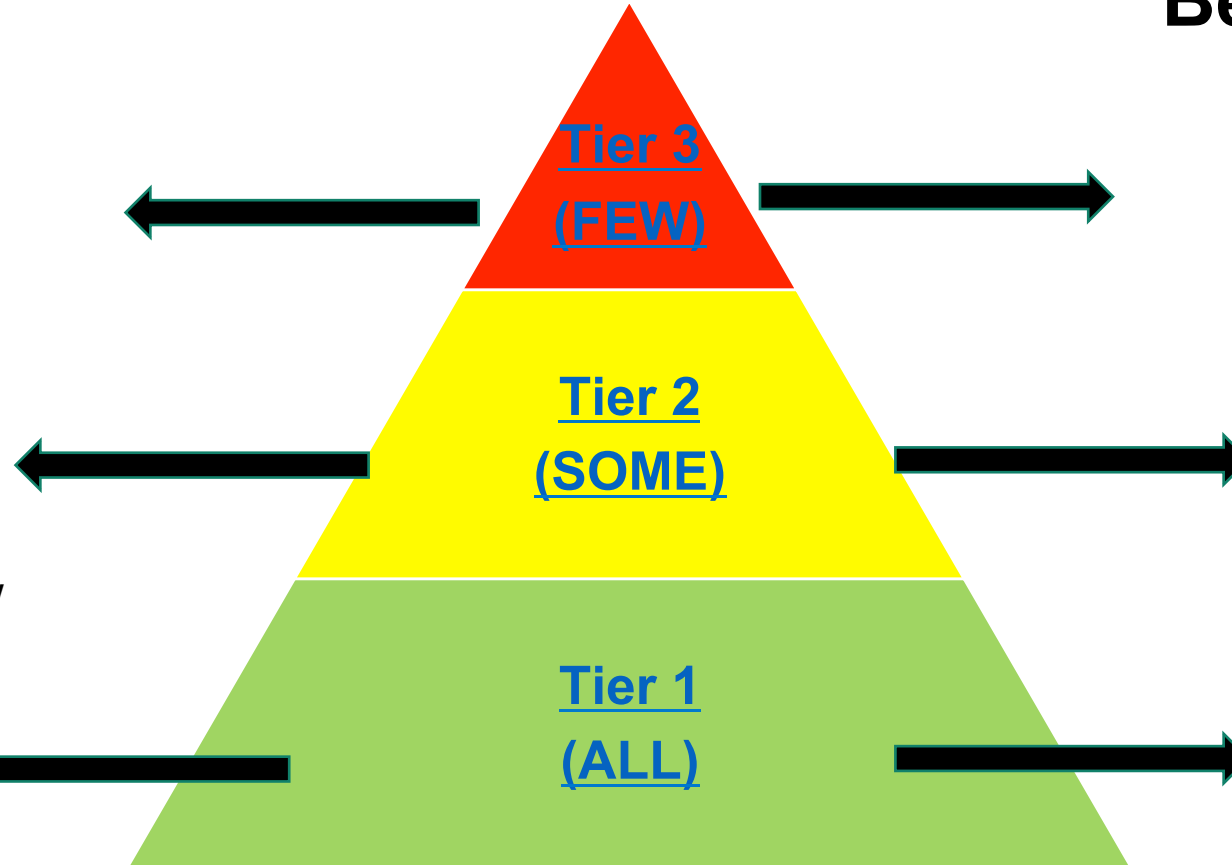
