**Specialty areas:** 3 computer labs for business and computer applications and a computer lab for drafting; a model lab, an iPad lab, a Dell notebook lab in auto mechanics; a computer lab for virtual schooling and USCL Distance Education classes; a vocational building that includes a large auto mechanics shop, a drafting room, an agriculture shop and a weight room for athletics. The school was renovated in 2011 to include new wiring, new lighting, new windows and new heating and air conditioning. The 800-seat auditorium was also renovated.
