• Making Middle Grades Work (MMGW) is designed for students between the ages of 11 and 16.

Too many students leave the middles grades unpepared to succeed in rigorous high school studies and unable to take advantage of all high school can offer. By ninth grade, many struggling students have fallen behind and are on a path to become high school dropouts.

Through SREB's middle grades initiative, SREB states are among the first in the nation to implement strategies that address the crucial middle grades and key transition into high school. Making Middle Grades Work (MMGW) helps states, districts and schools look at what they expect, what they teach and how they teach young adolescents to prepare for success in further education.

Our school, in partnership with MMGW, is commmitted to improving school and classroom practices in the middle grades by implementing a framework of Key Practices and conditions for continuous improvement. The MMGW brochure, *Making Middle Grades Work: An Enhanced Design to Prepare All*

- RAM Tough Book Clubs R(eading) A(nd) M(eeting) Clubs are small voluntary book clubs held during lunch. Teachers facilitate small groups of students who choose to meet and discuss a particular book while they eat lunch.
- Food for Thought Students who demonstrate they are exemplary readers and writers are invited to a quarterly lunch in the media center. The focus of these luncheons varies. Local authors may describe their writing process, the media specialist might book-talk great new books or students might design book promotion tools to air on Rucker AM. Other reading incentives include Clemson/Carolina reading program and the SCJBA voting party.

- **Beta Club** This nationally recognized organization runs the school bookstore and provides many service-related projects for its members.
- **Football** This sport is available to our 7th and 8th grade students.
- **Basketball** This sport is available to our 7th and 8th grade students.

- **Cheerleading** This sport is available to our 7th and 8th grade students.
- **Band** All interested students are encouraged to participate. We strive to provide instruments for students who may not be able to afford one. The band performs at pep rallies, ballgames and semi-annual concerts. Rucker also provides classes for Chorus and Piano Lab.
- **Step Team** The Rucker Step Team is comprised of 6th through 8th grade students who exhibit a strong sense of dedication and cooperation. These students practice two to three times weekly to unify their step performance. Steppers compete in competitions, perform in community service events and perform at school functions.
- **Robotics** Sixth-eighth grade students build and program robots that complete specific tasks. They also research major problems that affect the world and present creative ways to solve the problems. The team has qualified for state competition and looks forward to a new season thanks to PTA sponsorship.
- Relay for Life School A.R. Rucker sponsors a team each year for Relay for Life as part of our community service.
- **Rucker AM** This news crew prepares the broadcast each morning. Anchors, technical directors and special correspondents develop the content of each program.



- **Jr. Civitans** This nationally recognized organization heads up community-service projects for the school.
- **First Priority** Student-led evangelical club.
- Chess Club Teaches students how to play chess and use critical thinking skills
- **Drama Club** Allows students to express themselves through performance.
