Our school programs

- Literacy Inclusion To Meet The Needs of Kids Every Day (LINKED) LINKED provides an early intervention, enrichment and acceleration program for all students. A certified Reading Recovery teacher, classroom teachers and trained instructional assistants assess students and provide leveled ability small group instruction in grades K-5.
- Accelerated Reader The program encourages students in all grade levels to read by providing
 incentives and special events. Students read and then take a computerized assessment to ensure reading
 comprehension. AR promotes accountability and also prepares students for middle and high school,
 where AR is also used as an instructional tool.
- **School-within-a-School Discovery Program** The Discovery Program provides instruction to a diverse population of students in a unique learning environment with special emphasis on academic innovation and flexibility while encouraging students to excel in one or more areas of intelligence and promoting professional development opportunities for educators.
- Math TIME (Targeted Instruction In Math Everyday) This is a math block where students receive math instruction based on MAP and PASS data as well as grade-level assessments.



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 Early Education Family Night Program – Training session for incoming kindergarten parents to support parent education in the area of providing literacy-based and math activities at home, to acquaint parents and students with school programs and services, to provide information on transitioning to school and to explain involvement activities.

Our co-curriculum, clubs, athletics

- **Fifth-Grade Chorus** The chorus provides a wonderful opportunity for approximately 45-55 students. Since this is an auditioned group, the students are serious about working, learning, and performing to the best of their ability. The chorus performs several times during the year, including the county-wide choral festival.
- WBES Morning News Morning news is broadcast throughout our school at the beginning of each day. The news is produced by students using Apple technology. Guest students are chosen to share classroom highlights. Trivia, weather, lunch menu, and other school news are reported. This provides an opportunity to enhance students' communication skills.
- Homework Center, Before- & After-school Programs These programs provide academic assistance Monday through Friday. Each session is designed to provide "prescriptive" instruction based on MAP, PASS and classroom assessments in writing, reading comprehension and math.

Our parents/parent support programs

- **SIC** School Improvement Council (SIC) members help with the scheduling of events and the preparation of the meals for family nights.
- **PTO** The Parent Teacher Organization supports the school through fundraisers each year. In the fall, a traditional sale of items is held. A Boosterthon Fun Run is held in January. This two-week character-building program raises money through sponsorships of laps run by individual students. Every child participates in the Fun Run regardless of money sponsored. This fundraiser is designed to build community and a sense of collaboration among all. Spring Fling at BES is bigger and better than ever! This family fun day incorporates business vendors, yummy food items and lots of mega inflatables for everyone to enjoy. BES is fortunate to have the support of our families and area businesses.
- **Volunteer Program** Throughout the year, Discovery parents volunteer 30 hours or more per family, a required component of the program.
- **Family Involvement** Parents are given numerous opportunities to volunteer throughout the year during field trips, events, Career Week and other special occasions.
