Our school programs

• **Leader in Me School** – Each member of our school family shares their leadership by living Stephen Covey's 7 + 1 Habits, which include: Habit 1 – Be Proactive; Habit 2 – Begin with the End in Mind; Habit 3 – Put First Things First; Habit 4 – Think Win-Win; Habit 5 – Seek First to Understand, Then to be Understood; Habit 6 – Synergize; Habit 7 – Sharpen the Saw; Habit 8 – Find Your Voice and Help Others Find Theirs.

- Accelerated Reader The program encourages students in all grade levels to read by providing
 incentives and special events. Students read and then take a computerized assessment to ensure reading
 comprehension.
- Math TIME (Targeted Instruction In Math Everyday) This is a math block where students receive math instruction based on MAP and PASS data as well as grade-level assessments.
- **LLI (Leveled Literacy Instruction)** This reading intervention provides students reading instruction on their readiness level.



• **SPIRE** – This research-based reading intervention provides explicit instruction in phonological awareness, word building, decoding, reading, spelling and dictation.

Our co-curriculum, clubs, athletics

- **Leadership Positions** Students have leadership positions in the classroom and apply for schoolwide leadership roles. Students are interviewed and hired for roles that support authentic leadership experience including school photographers, tutors, tour guides, gardeners and many more.
- **Leader in Me Clubs** Each faculty member sponsors a club. Students choose their clubs based on their interests. Clubs include Trash to Treasure, STEM, puzzles, board games, wacky science, arts and crafts, fishing, yoga and many more. Our clubs provide students the opportunity to get to know another caring adult in our school family.
- **Fifth-Grade Chorus** The chorus provides a wonderful opportunity for approximately 40 students. Since this is an auditioned group, the students are serious about working, learning, and performing to the best of their ability. The chorus performs several times during the year, including the county-wide choral festival and out fifth-grade promotion ceremony.
- WBES Morning News Morning news is broadcast throughout our school at the beginning of each day. The news is produced by students using Apple technology. Guest students are chosen to share classroom highlights. Inspirational leadership stories, quotes, trivia, weather, lunch menu, and other school news are reported. This provides an opportunity to enhance students' communication skills and support leadership.
- Homework Center, Before- & After-school Programs These programs provide academic assistance Monday through Friday. Each session is designed to provide "prescriptive" instruction based on MAP, SCREADY and classroom assessments in writing, reading comprehension and math.
- Leader in Me Clubs Each faculty member sponsors a club. Students choose their club based on their interests. Clubs include trash to treasure, STEM, puzzles, board games, wacky science, arts and crafts, fishing, YOGA and many more. Our clubs provide students the opportunity to get to know another caring adult in our school family.
