Our school programs

- Leader in Me Lighthouse School Each member of our school family shares their leadership by living Stephen Covey's 7 + 1 Habits, which include: Habit 1 Be Proactive; Habit 2 Begin with the End in Mind; Habit 3 Put First Things First; Habit 4 Think Win-Win; Habit 5 Seek First to Understand, Then to be Understood; Habit 6 Synergize; Habit 7 Sharpen the Saw; Habit 8 Find Your Voice and Help Others Find Theirs.
- Math TIME (Targeted Instruction In Math Everyday) This is a math block where students receive math instruction based on MAP and PASS data as well as grade-level assessments.
- LLI (Leveled Literacy Instruction) This reading intervention provides students reading instruction on their readiness level.
- **SPIRE** This research-based reading intervention provides explicit instruction in phonological awareness, word building, decoding, reading, spelling and dictation.



Our co-curriculum, clubs, athletics

- Leadership Positions Students have leadership positions in the classroom and apply for school wide leadership roles. Students are interviewed and hired for roles that support authentic leadership experience including school photographers, tutors, tour guides, gardeners and many more.
- **Fifth-Grade Chorus** The chorus provides a wonderful opportunity for approximately 40 students. Since this is an auditioned group, the students are serious about working, learning, and performing to the best of their ability. The chorus performs several times during the year, including the county-wide choral festival and out fifth-grade promotion ceremony.
- WBES Morning News Morning news is broadcast throughout our school at the beginning of each day. The news is produced by students using Apple technology. Guest students are chosen to share classroom highlights. Inspirational leadership stories, quotes, trivia, weather, lunch menu, and other school news are reported. This provides an opportunity to enhance students' communication skills and support leadership.
- Homework Center, Before- & After-school Programs These programs provide academic assistance Monday through Friday. Each session is designed to provide "prescriptive" instruction based on MAP, SCREADY and classroom assessments in writing, reading comprehension and math.
- Leader in Me Clubs Each faculty member sponsors a club. Students choose their club based on their interests. Clubs include trash to treasure, STEM, puzzles, board games, wacky science, arts and crafts, fishing, YOGA and many more. Our clubs provide students the opportunity to get to know another caring adult in our school family.
- **ILEAD** iLead is a leadership development program for our 4th and 5th grade students. The purpose of iLead is to allow students to learn about leadership qualities, connect with their peers in a positive setting, and model leadership behaviors to other students. Community service, self-discipline, and integrity are key concepts the students learn while engaging in the iLead program. Throughout this program, students have the opportunity to complete service projects at school and at home. The goal of iLead is to encourage leadership development in all students and create a positive culture at school, home, and in our community.
- Leadership, Lunch and Learn Students share virtually with their parents how they are growing as leaders and learners.

- **SIC** School Improvement Council (SIC) members help with the scheduling of events and the preparation of the meals for family nights.
- **PTO** The Parent Teacher Organization supports the school through fundraisers each year. In the fall, a traditional catalog sale is held. A Boosterthon Fun Run is held in January. This two-week character-building program raises money through sponsorships of laps run by individual students. Every child participates in the Fun Run regardless of money sponsored. This fundraiser is designed to build community and a sense of collaboration among all, while supporting leadership. BES is fortunate to have the support of our families, our community churches and area businesses.
- **Family Involvement** Parents are given numerous opportunities to volunteer throughout the year during field trips, school events and celebrations, Career Week and other special occasions.
- Leader In Me Family Challenge Our Leader In Me Family Challenge is a program that integrates the Leader In Me Habits at home. The purpose of this challenge is to encourage time spent together, create a stronger family unit, and deepen the understanding of the 7+1 Habits. This program allows for our students, the experts on Leader In Me, to teach their families the Habits through 20 weekly activities they will complete together. The goal of the challenge is to provide meaningful learning experiences regarding the 7+1 Habits, as well as carving out 600 minutes for families to learn about each other on a deeper level.
