## Programs unique to our school

- **ACE Club** This club is extremely active and serves 5<sup>th</sup> grade students who have excellent academics and citizenship. The group is responsible for jobs around the school, and they provide assistance to teachers and other students through a Study Buddy Program. The ACE Club also is in charge of writing and producing our Babblin' Bears Morning News Program.
- **Art Therapy** The guidance counselor and art teacher meet with the identified students weekly to discuss students' concerns through the use of art.
- Reading Counts Students are encouraged to read for pleasure while providing incentives for being able to answer comprehension questions.
- Pioneer Day and World War II Day 5<sup>th</sup> grade students present a living history presentation which
  depicts life during the Westward Expansion of our country and presents life during WWII.
- **Artsonia** This is an online gallery where your child can see his or her artwork published. Once you have created your account, family and friends will be able to download your child's art.
- Advanced Art Twenty students from grades 4 and 5 are selected by talent and interest in art. The group creates projects. This program prepares students for future work in the arts.



- **B.E.A.R.S** Boys Exercising And Running Strong is a fitness program for the 4th and 5th grade boys at Erwin Elementary School. Coach Sinclair and Mr. Bradley are in charge of the program. Coach Sinclair and Mr. Bradley have created this program to give young boys the opportunity to get more physically fit and learn how to start living a healthy lifestyle. Currently the program is free to the students involved.
- **K/Grade 1 Chorus** Consists of 45-50 kindergarten and first grade students. The chorus is led by Mrs. Vaughn and Mrs. Laney. Mrs. Ribelin helps choose the participants based on their love for music and participation in Music class. Rehearsals are held during school hours. The chorus performs at Christmas and again in the spring, if time permits.
- **Girls on the Run** This is a program that encourages girls in grades 3-5 to develop self-respect and healthy lifestyles through running. Girls are taught lessons twice a week that promote physical, emotional, mental, and social well-being. At the end of the season the program culminates with a 5K race.
- KidBiz3000 This provides a Web-based, individualized reading and writing instruction that delivers
  differentiated assignments based on each student's Lexile level. KidBiz enables teachers to customize
  content and monitor student growth.
- **Keyboard Lab** Erwin has a full keyboard lab to be used during music class.
- **Fishing for Good Behavior** This is a school-wide positive reinforcement initiative for good behavior.
- **Literacy Garden** Our outdoor literacy garden provides an enriching and stimulating environment to read and learn.
- **Jump Rope Club** This program encourages fitness for young students.

### Our co-curriculum, clubs, athletics

- **Book Writing Club** This group writes and illustrates books for possible publication.
- Advanced Art Club Students who excel in the arts meet each week to create backdrops for programs, artwork to be displayed and art entries for local contests.
- Relay for Life Team and Activities Throughout the year, the team holds events to raise money for cancer research. Events are as follows: Christmas Dance, Spring Dance, Dunking Booth, Luminary sales, Relay bracelet sales, etc.
- **Student Council** The student council provides service learning activities and events for the community.
- **Drama Club** The drama club provides opportunity for students in grades 2 and 3 to demonstrate their talents.
- **Chorus** Our chorus provides vocal opportunities for students in grades 4 and 5.
- **K 1 Chorus** This group provides opportunities for students in K and grade 1 to feel comfortable performing for an audience.
