## Programs unique to our school

- **ACE Club** – This club is extremely active and serves 5<sup>th</sup> grade students who have excellent academics and citizenship. The group is responsible for jobs around the school, and they provide assistance to teachers and other students through a Study Buddy Program. The ACE Club also is in charge of writing and producing our Babblin' Bears Morning News Program.
- **Technology/Leveled Literacy Intervention After-School Program** - Fifty-five students from grades 3, 4, and 5 participate in this program each afternoon. The students work on Study Island, Moby Max, Reflex Math, and keyboarding when they are in the lab. Half of the students are pulled daily to receive LLI.

- **Artsonia** – This is an online gallery where your child can see his or her artwork published. Once an account is created, family and friends are able to purchase the art.
- **Random Acts of Kindness** – Our guidance counselor works with a group of students who complete acts of kindness for staff and students.
- **K/Grade 1 Chorus** – This consists of approximately 24 students who work to prepare a parent program twice a year.
- **Girls on the Run** – This is a program that encourages girls in grades 3-5 to develop self-respect and healthy lifestyles through running. Girls are taught lessons which promote physical, emotional, mental, and social well-being. This program is offered most years.
- **Robotics** – Our /robotics team meets on most Tuesday afternoons to prepare for a competition. This is a STEM activity.
- **Jump Rope Club** – This program promotes fitness for students and are taught about support and being judgment free of each other's skills.

## Our co-curriculum, clubs, athletics

- **Advanced Art Club** – Students who excel in the arts meet each week to create backdrops for programs, artwork to be displayed and art entries for local contests.
- **Relay for Life Team and Activities** – Throughout the year, the team holds events to raise money for cancer research. Events are as follows: Christmas Dance, Spring Dance, Dunking Booth, Luminary sales, Relay bracelet sales, etc.
- **Student Council** – The student council provides service learning activities and events for the community.
- **Chorus** – Our chorus provides vocal opportunities for students in grades 4 and 5.
- **K – 1 Chorus** – This group provides opportunities for students in K and grade 1 to feel comfortable performing for an audience.
