- **iRead** This is a school-wide buddy reading program developed and implemented to help build students' reading fluency and confidence, while building a relationship with a student on a different grade

We have a reading coach and technology coach who support teachers as well as students. We offer a gifted-talented program as well as a reading enrichment program that meets the needs of our students on all levels. We also offer Study Island and RAZ Kids computer-based programs designed to support our classroom instruction, both in the classroom and at home.

- Strong community and parent involvement including excellent communication We believe that learning is a team sport and that we can't be successful without support from staff, students, parents and the community. We have a supportive PTO that works to match classrooms with parent volunteers, provides funding for programs and technology that are needed in the school, grounds and building enhancement projects, and focuses on encouraging the team atmosphere we rely on. We have an active School Improvement Committee that seeks feedback to ensure our programs are meeting the needs of our families. We keep our parents informed in a variety of ways including weekly parent emails from teachers, weekly parent ConnectED phone calls, regularly-updated website and a variety of social media outlets.
- Cooperative learning teams We work hard to establish a team culture in our school. Each grade works together as a team to meet the needs of the students and to contribute to the overall school team. Teachers in individual grade levels meet weekly to collaborate on the best ways to provide instruction and to analyze performance data. Teachers work together to adjust and modify if necessary to make sure the needs of all students are being met. Teachers focus on a standards-driven instructional model which is matched with interdisciplinary approaches to deliver the best possible instruction to students. We require all subject areas to incorporate a balance of whole-group instruction and small-group instruction, as well as individual conferencing to make sure each child is met on his/her level. Administration and support staff are a large part of the team and are involved in all staff meetings.
