Our school strengths

Diverse academic and enrichment programs – Programs include visual and performing arts as well as academics. In addition to art, music, physical education, media, and computer, students also participate in a hands-on Science lab. In addition, students utilize our Classworks lab on a rotating basis to enhance learning in Language Arts and Mathematics. Pre-Honors classes and enrichment opportunities are available for students who excel academically or struggle academically. Every teacher offers free tutoring before or after school for students. Parent/teacher conferences are scheduled throughout the year to foster strong communication between school and home.

Social equity – A major focus at ILMS is to provide opportunities that cater to the interests of all students. Every student participates in club activities during the school day that involves opportunities such as: dance, journalism, video gaming, intramurals, yearbook, history and many more!

Structured organization – All stakeholders (students, staff, and community) play an important role in the success of our school. Our student council, PTO, SIC, volunteers and community partnerships work together to support the mission and goals of our school. Our administrators meet with stakeholders regularly to share information about our school and to learn more about the needs/desires of the community.

Communication and parent involvement – ILMS encourages and seeks involvement from stakeholders in the school. Our PTO, guidance counselors, and community partnership coordinate works to match needs of the

school with volunteers. Our goal is to create a climate that promotes learning through the family and community. To achieve this, we work to provide parents with opportunities to be involved. Several initiatives to promote connection and communication include regularly updated web pages by school personnel, a school calendar with important dates and information, monthly newsletters, weekly bulletins, weekly automated phone calls and e-mails and more.

Small learning communities – While our enrollment continues to grow, we feel it is vital to maintain small learning communities. Each grade level is divided into teams. Teachers participate in grade level, team, and departmental meetings. Leadership team members and all new teachers also meet regularly. Teachers meet with administrators regularly to discuss ways in which instruction has been individualized in the classroom and to share facility and individual student concerns.
