- **Making Middle Grade Work**: The purpose of this initiative is to develop, implement, evaluate and refine a comprehensive, whole-school improvement effort that will help all middle grade students receive a high-quality, challenging and appropriate education which prepares them for success in college-preparatory level courses .
- **Mustang Mentors:** Every student is matched with an adult advisor (faculty and staff) through Mustang Mentors. The goal is to build positive relationships between and among faculty and students.
- **Clubs:** Each month, students are given the opportunity to broaden their horizons through a self-selected club. Clubs vary from athletic-based to arts and crafts.
- **WSMS:** Students are kept up to date on events through WSMS, our school news program. WSMS airs through classroom television each morning during homebase.
- **Read-alouds:** Faculty and staff participate in school-wide read-alouds periodically throughout the year. Teachers also incorporate into their curriculum appropriate read-alouds for their topics of study.

- **Teacher Book Studies** Each year every teacher participates in a book study. *See Me After Class* will kick off our school year. Students and teachers will also read a Bluford series novel centering around bullying during the first week of school.
- **Silent Reading** Students begin each morning in homeroom with silent reading. Students have the option of choosing their own book or reading a teacher-selected book.
- **TMD Field Trips** Our TMD class goes bowling throughout the year. At the end of the year, they compete in the Special Olympics bowling tournament as well as the Special Olympics in Rock Hill.
- **Counseling** Our counselors meet the needs of our students through career lessons, small groups and individual counseling.
- **Mentors** Eight faculty members have completed teacher mentoring training.
