Student Achievement

Indian Land Elementary School is helping all students develop the World Class Skills and Life and Career Characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate.

- Students exceeded the district and state averages on the South Carolina College and Career-Ready (SCREADY) assessments in 2022.
 - In ELA, 64.3% of 3rd grade and 77.2% of 4th grade ILE students met or exceeded expectations
 - In Math, 68% of 3rd grade and 72.4% of 4th grade ILE students met or exceeded expectations.
- Students in Kindergarten, 1st Grade, and 2nd Grade emerged higher in their performance on MAP Math and Reading assessments throughout the year than the national and district averages.
