

Use of Drones on District Property

Issued date: Aug. 28, 2018` Rescinds:

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Our district realizes that drones make possible unique perspectives of school events, property and facilities; however, the use of drones inappropriately and outside the *Federal Aviation Administration* rules and regulations may

- put the well-being of students, staff and visitors at risk,
- result in damage to school property or the property of individuals at our schools, offices and athletic facilities and
- place the district at risk of liability.

For these reasons, the district requires any individual who wants to originate a drone flight from school district property or fly over our property

- be a licensed commercial drone pilot through the FAA,
- contact a district administrator for approval to begin or end a flight on school district property and
- follow all FAA rules and guidelines.

Any individual who does not comply with the district regulations and FAA rules and guidelines will be reported to the FAA.

The district will also pursue appropriate legal action in the event that a person on school district property is injured or district property is damaged by an individual using a drone outside district regulations and FAA rules and guidelines.
